The Companies contracted by the Insurers to carry out the repairs have almost (finally) concluded their work. That wall is to be reconstructed. The scaffolding remains at the back of the Church as there is a problem ensuring a watertight seal between the existing and the new roof panels which they installed. They assure me they have a solution but the weather has been too dry to test it.
